In its quest to enhance the life chances of the populace through the improvement of the quality of teaching and learning at all levels in the education system, the Ministry of Education has renewed its efforts in respect of data collection.

For accurate reporting on the achievements in the sector and for overcoming challenges, it is important that data are collected at the level of the school to inform the decision-making processes and to chart the forward movement and future actions within the sector.

Education is a dynamic sector which must be responsive to the changes which occur in the economy and in the society. As education must also fulfill a transformative function, educators and administrators have the responsibility of creating multiple opportunities within learning environments for students to critically acquire knowledge, skills and attitudes which redound to the benefit of the entire society. 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Executive Summary

The Digest of Annual Statistics is reflective of data from the 1995-1996 to 2012-2013 Academic Year. The document is prepared primarily by the Planning and Research Units within the Ministry of Education in St. Vincent and the Grenadines with assistance from the other departments within the Ministry of Education. It is intended that through analysis of the data provided, trends from previous years would become clearer, providing a better understanding of our current situation and guiding us in our future projections. The 2013 Education Statistical Digest has been expanded to incorporate some aspects of Early Childhood Development.

The Ministry of Education has divided the country into eleven (11) districts based on geographic location. Hence, the Statistical Digest seeks to summarize trends in the Education System by exploring trends at the national, district, school and gender levels with specific focus on educational expenditure, teacher qualifications, pupil enrolment and performance.


A synopsis of the figures indicates that there is a decreasing enrolment at the primary level from 21,997 in 1995-1996 to 13,609 in 2012-2013. This reduction may be partially attributed to a -2.3% decrease in population between 1991 and 2001¹. At the secondary level, there was an increase in enrolment from 7,689 in 1995-1996 to 12,026 in 2007-2008 and a decrease to 10,394 in 2012-2013. The increased enrolment in the period 2005 to 2010 can be attributed to the introduction of Universal Access to Secondary Education. Consequently the termination of the senior school system in 2005 resulted in the increased transitioning of pupils into the secondary cycle. Hence, there was a resulting rapid increase in enrolment until 2010, when the new entrants completed their fifth form education.



Introduction



Early Childhood Education

Presently, there are one hundred and twenty five (125) early childhood centres. Of these, 116 are privately operated while the remaining nine are (9) government institutions. Together, all 125 institutions cater for children between ages three to five years. There are currently 350 children enrolled in the nine government owned early childhood centres and another 3913 in the remaining 116 privately owned institutions which are managed by Church Boards, non-governmental organizations, community groups and other private entities. This partnership between the government and private institutions to provide early quality care and development to all pre-schoolers is in keeping with the government's thrust towards the achievement of universal access to Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD).

Significant progress has been made towards the improvement of the quality of the teaching and learning process in this sector. The government has provided assistance to upgrade the physical environment of a number of privately operated early childhood centres. Also, the State continues to provide on-going training for preschool teachers and supervisors. Additionally, the government provides an annual subvention to all privately operated early childhood centres with an enrolment of fifteen or more students. The overall aim is to ensure that all preschool children access quality early childhood education at minimal or no cost to parents. Cost reduction and improved access is of even more significance for those children residing in disadvantaged communities who would otherwise be unable to access early childhood services.

This section of the digest provides important data on the Early Childhood Sector for the academic year 2012-2013 on enrolment, staffing and their level of training.



Primary Education

There are currently sixty eight (68) primary institutions of which 57 are public. Eight (8) of these primary schools are in the Grenadines. The primary enrolment for 2012-2013 stands at 13,609. This indicates a drop of 202 students below the 2012 figure which stood at 13,811. The declining primary enrolment, noticeable since 1995, is reflective of the overall decrease population. As stated in the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Population and Housing Census Report 2001 there was a decrease of 2.3% between 1991 and 2001. Further analysis of this trend in the population would be facilitated when the 2012 Census Report becomes available.

Primary education continues to receive the largest share of the education recurrent budget with salaries, wages and allowances accounting for 96% of the allocation. The recurrent allocation for primary education in 2013 is \$39,480,001 which is a slight increase over the 2012 estimates of \$38,748,970. The primary system continues to receive a sizable proportion of the budgetary allocation as the Ministry of Education strives to improve the quality of education throughout the sector.

Secondary Education

Secondary Education in St. Vincent and the Grenadines is provided by 26 institutions, 19 of which are public. The remaining seven schools are owned by churches but operate with substantial financial assistance from the Government. These seven schools are referred to as Assisted Secondary (AS) schools. Of the twenty-six (26) secondary schools, twenty-three (23) are situated on Mainland of St. Vincent and three (3) are in the Grenadines – two on Bequia in the Northern Grenadines and one on Union Island in the Southern Grenadines. Twenty two secondary schools are co-educational. There are two single-sex, all-male, secondary schools and two single-sex, all-female, secondary schools.

In 2014 students will set the Caribbean Primary Exit Assessment (CPEA) administered by the Caribbean Examination Council (CXC). The CPEA replaces the national Common Entrance Examination (CEE) which previously determined which students obtained the chance to attend the secondary school of their choice. However, all students in accordance with the policy of the Ministry of Education will be offered a place at a secondary school. The criteria for secondary school selections will remain as established by the Ministry of Education.






