A cursory and intimate analysis of student performance during this unprecedented period of challenge has revealed certain deficits in our education system.

The Ministry of Education and National Reconciliation has committed to the purposeful use of limited resources on a recovery of learning quest. During the period of heightened challenges, instructional time was loss and the quality of the learning experience diminished, despite numerous attempts at creative responses.

The data provided for the period of assessment demonstrates a widening of the divide that is reflective of the disparity in resources available to learners across the education system. Policy interventions aimed at promoting equity must be fiercely advocated as a resolution during this period of transition to a state of relative normalcy. Global approaches that are driven by the mantra of "Education Transformation" must resonate with local stakeholders to achieve meaningful results.

Data gathering and sharing should be at the forefront of policy responses and the Ministry of Education through the office of the Education Planner must continue to produce quality information that will guide decisions making. Proper problem identification and planning lends itself to more effective interventions and implementation. Quality data must therefore form the basis for any creative response.

An analysis of the data produced during the review period demonstrates an increase in the rate of attrition and repetition. Attrition and repetition are particularly prevalent among males at the secondary level and more typical of certain education institutions.

The Ministry of Education in its attempt to transform the education system will focus on the annually generated quantitative and qualitative research being cognizant of the important role od data in decision making.




### Message from the Chief Education Officer- Mrs. Kay Martin-Jack

## Definitions for Selected Indicators for Monitoring of the Education Sector

#### ACCESS INDICATORS

#### Net Enrolment Ratio in Early Childhood Care and Education

Total number of children enrolled in early childhood care and education programs, 0-2 and 3-4, expressed as a percentage of the population of the using the corresponding cohorts. This indicator measures the general level of participation of young children in ECCE programs. It also indicates a country's capacity to prepare young children for primary education.

#### Gross Intake Ratio (GIR) in the First Grade of Primary

Total number of new entrants in the first grade of primary education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the population at the official primary school-entrance age.

This indicates the general level of access to primary education. It also indicates the capacity of the education system to provide access to Kindergarten for the official school-entrance age population.

#### Net Intake Rate (NIR) in the First Grade of Primary

New entrants in the first grade of primary education that are of the official primary school-entrance age, expressed as a percentage of the population of the same age. It is the norm that some students may enter the primary system just prior to their 5<sup>th</sup> birthday.

#### Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER)

Total enrolment in a specific level of education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the eligible official school-age population corresponding to the same level of education in a given school year. The GER shows the general level of participation in a given level of education. It indicates the capacity of the education system to enroll students of a particular age group. It can also be a complementary indicator to net enrolment rate (NER) by indicating the extent of overaged and under-aged enrolment.

# Net Enrolment Rate (NER)

This refers to the enrolment of the official age group for a given level of education expressed as a percentage of the corresponding population of the official age group. The NER reflects the extent of coverage in a given level of education of children and youths belonging to the official age group corresponding to the given level of education.

# Age Specific Enrolment Rate (ASER)

Enrolment of a specific single age enrolled, irrespective of the level of education, as a percentage of the population of the same age. It is the extent of the educational participation of a specific age cohort.

#### Percentage of Private Enrolment

Enrolment in private educational institutions at a given level of education expressed as a percentage of total enrolment at the same level. The measure provides the relative weight of private education in terms of enrolment, hence the scale and capacity of private education within a country.

### INTERNAL EFFICIENCY INDICATORS

#### Promotion Rate by Grade

Proportion of pupils from a cohort enrolled in a specific grade of a given school year who study in the next grade in the following school year. Promotion measures the performance of the education system in advancing pupils from a cohort from grade to grade, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. It is also a key indicator for analyzing and projecting pupil flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle.

#### Repetition Rate by Grade (RR)

Proportion of pupils from a cohort enrolled in a specific grade at a given school year who remain in the same grade in the following school year. Repetition shows the rate at which pupils from a cohort repeat a grade, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. In addition, it is one of the key indicators for analyzing and projecting pupil flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle.

#### Dropout Rate by Grade (DR)

Proportion of pupils from a cohort enrolled in a given grade at a given school year who are no longer enrolled in the following school year. Premature exiting measures the phenomenon of pupils from a cohort leaving school without completion, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. In addition, it is one of the key indicators for analyzing and projecting pupil flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle.

# Transition Rate (TR)

The number of students admitted to the first grade of a higher level of education in a given year, expressed as a percentage of the number of students enrolled in the final grade of the lower level of education in the previous year. Transitioning to a higher cycle conveys information on the degree of access or transition from one cycle or level of education to a higher one. Viewed from the lower cycle or level of education, it is considered as an output indicator, viewed from the higher educational cycle or level, it constitutes an indicator of access. It can also help in assessing the relative selectivity of an education system, which can be due to pedagogical or financial requirements.

#### Pupil-Teacher Ratio (PTR)

This is the average number of pupils per teacher at a specific level of education in a given school year. To measure the level of human resources input in terms of the number of teachers in relation

to the size of the pupil population. The results can be compared with established national norms on the number of pupils per teacher for each level or type of education.

# Percentage of Trained Teachers

Number of teachers who have received the minimum organized teacher training (pre-service or inservice) required for teaching at the specified level of education in the given country, expressed as a percentage of the total number of teachers at the same level of education. This measures the proportion of teachers trained in pedagogical skills, according to national standards, to effectively teach and use the available instructional materials. It reveals also a country's commitment to invest in the development of its human capital involved in teaching activities.

# Out-of-School Children

Children in the official primary school age range who are not enrolled in either primary or secondary schools. To identify the size of the population in the official primary school age range who should be targeted for policies and efforts in achieving universal primary education.

# FINANCING INDICATORS

# Public Expenditure on Education as a Percentage of Gross Domestic Product.

Total public expenditure on education (current and capital) expressed as a percentage of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in a given financial year. This indicator shows the proportion of a country's domestic production generated during a given financial year that has been spent by government authorities on education.

#### Public Expenditure on Education as a Percentage of Total Government Expenditure

Total public expenditure on education (current and capital) expressed as a percentage of total government expenditure in a given financial year. It shows a government's policy emphasis on education relative to the perceived value of other public investments. It reflects also the commitment of a government to invest in human capital development.

#### Percentage Distribution of Public Current Expenditure on Education by Level

Public current expenditure for each level of education, expressed as a percentage of total public current expenditure on education. The measure shows how financial resources for education have been distributed across the different levels or stages of education. It measures the relative emphasis of government spending on a particular level of education within the overall educational expenditure.

#### Public current expenditure per pupil as a percentage of Gross Domestic Production per Capita

Public current expenditure per pupil at each level of education, expressed as a percentage of GDP per capita in a given financial year. This is the share of per capita income spent on each pupil. It helps in assessing a country's level of investment in human capital development. When calculated by level of education, it also indicates the relative costs and emphasis placed by the country on a particular level of education.

#### Educational Attainment of the Population Aged 15-24 Years and Above

The percentage distribution of population aged 15-24 years and above according to the highest level of education attained or completed with reference to ISCED. To show the educational composition of the population aged 15-24 years and above, hence the stock and quality of human capital within a country, so as to gauge needs and establish policies for upgrading it. This indicator also reflects the structure and performance of the education system and its accumulated impact on human capital formation.

#### Percentage Distribution of Enrolment in Secondary Education by Type of Education Program

Percentage distribution of students enrolled in secondary education, according to the orientation of the education program, i.e. general and vocational/technical education, including teacher training. To reflect the orientation and capacity of secondary education programs as well as the potential supply of skilled workers in different specializations.

#### Gross Primary Graduation Ratio (GPGR)

Total number of graduates from the last grade of primary education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the population at the theoretical graduation age for primary. It is an indication of the general level of primary education graduation. This proxy measure of primary completion reports the current primary outputs stemming from previous years of schooling and past education policies on entrance to primary education. It also indicates the capacity of the education system to provide primary graduation for the theoretical graduation age population.

#### Gender Parity Index (GPI)

The ratio of female to male values of a given indicator. The GPI measures progress towards gender parity in education participation and/or learning opportunities available for women in relation to those available to men. It also reflects the level of women's empowerment in society.

#### Youth Literacy Rate

The number of persons aged 15 to 24 years who can both read and write with understanding a short simple statement on their everyday life, divided by the population in that age group. Generally, 'literacy' also encompasses 'numeracy', the ability to make simple arithmetic calculations. The literacy rate reflects recent outcomes of the basic education process. It is a summary measure of the effectiveness of the education system.

#### Early Childhood Education


Early Childhood education development is a pivotal pillar in the educational policies and programmes of the Government of St. Vincent and the Grenadines. The government continues to invest tremendous financial resources to support private and public early childhood institutions to improve the overall quality and access to early years' education.


Currently, there are one hundred and eight (108) early childhood centres in operation in St. Vincent and the Grenadines of which fifteen (15) are government owned and operated institutions. During the period under review eleven (11) privately owned centres closed due to declining enrolment at their institutions. For the academic year 2023-2024, the government is on schedule to open three (3) new early childhood centres, one (1) in Sandy Bay on the windward side of the island and two (2) in North Leeward in Chateaubelair and Fitz Hughes respectively. This is in keeping with the thrust of the government to ensure that all preschool children access quality early childhood education at minimal or no cost to parents.


The overall enrolment for the 2021/22 Academic year stood at two thousand seven hundred and seventy-three (2773), which was a decrease of three hundred and sixty-nine (369) from the previous three thousand one hundred and forty-two (3142) in 2020-2021. The enrolment in the private institutions decreased from two thousand seven hundred and thirty-six (2736) to two thousand three hundred and thirty-seven (2337), a decrease of 14.47%. At this time, the public institutions enrolment moved from four hundred and six (406) to four hundred and thirty-six (436), an increase of 7.39% (30 students).

This section of the digest provides important data on the Early Childhood Sector for the academic year 2021-2022 on enrolment, staffing and their level of training.







#### **Primary Education**

Primary education is the foundation of education in St. Vincent and the Grenadines, as it provides children with the necessary skills to succeed in their academic and personal lives. The government has recognized the importance of primary education and has therefore allocated the largest portion of the national budget to it. This financial support has enabled the country to provide quality education to its children, ensuring they have a bright future ahead of them.

St. Vincent and the Grenadines has 67 primary schools, of which 10 are privately operated institutions. The government, is aware of the need to educate its citizens from a young age, consequently, every effort is being made to make this a reality. The government's support for education extends to both the public and privately operated institutions, ensuring that they too provide quality education to their students. The spread of primary schools in the country enables parents access to a school for their children, regardless of their financial situation.


School meals are also provided to students in St. Vincent and the Grenadines, ensuring that they have access to healthy meals that will fuel their learning. This provision eliminates the barrier to education that poverty can create, ensuring that all children have the opportunity to learn and grow. For the academic year 2021-2022 approximately 5300 students participated in the School Feeding Programme.


The primary pupil enrolment for 2021-2022 was 12,451, a decrease of 414 students compared to the previous academic year. Government or public institutions accommodate the majority of primary pupils, with private enrolment at 11.04%. The Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) for the 2021/2022 academic year was 97.70 while the Net Enrollment Rate stood at 91.24, indicating that the government's efforts to make primary education accessible to all have paid off. The high enrollment rate means that the majority of the country's children are receiving an education that will prepare them for secondary education and beyond. This section of the e Statistical Digest provides data regarding primary enrolment, student performance, the number of repeaters by institution, dropouts, the number of teachers in each institution and their qualifications, as well as the expenditure for this sector. Each of the above categories is further disaggregated by district, institution, and gender as appropriate.





### Special Needs Education

There are three (3) Special Needs schools, one in Kingstown, one in Georgetown and the other in Bequia. For the academic year 2021-2022, the School for Children with Special Needs Kingstown has the largest enrolment of students, thirty-(30) males and twenty-four (24) females, a total of fifty-four (54). Georgetown Special Needs school has an enrolment of fourteen (14) males and six (6) females and Sunshine School for Children (Bequia) has eighteen (18) males and seven (7) females.

In the 2021-2022 academic year, the overall enrolment in the special needs schools stood at sixtytwo (62) males and thirty-seven (37) females (total 99). The overall enrolment decreased by nineteen (19) students when compared with the previous year which had a total enrolment of one hundred and eighteen (118). Males continue to outnumber females at each of these institutions.

Special education continues to receive the impetus and support from the government in order meet the needs of these learners. The policy of the government is to ensure that all students including those with special educational needs receive effective learning opportunities. The long term goal is to move towards implementation of inclusive education through increased integration of students with special education needs into primary and secondary schools. To this end, a pilot inclusive project under the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Human Development Service Delivery Project will commence on the island of Bequia for the academic year 2023-2024. Students from the Sunshine School for Children will be integrated into regular the schools in Bequia.

The government under the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Human Development Service Delivery Project provided resources to support professional development training for special needs teachers and equipment for schools. The project will continue to provide support to teachers to improve their pedagogical skills which should enhance the teaching and learning processes. The evaluation of the pilot inclusive education project in Bequia will determine when the inclusive education project will roll out on the mainland on St. Vincent.


### Secondary Education


Secondary education plays a critical role in the development of St. Vincent and the Grenadines. The country achieved universal access to secondary education in 2005, which has significantly increased the number of students pursuing higher education. This achievement has helped to improve the overall education level of the country and has had a positive impact on the economy by helping to produce a skilled workforce that is able to meet the demands of various industries. Moreover, secondary education provides the foundation for further studies, leading to a better understanding of academic subjects and increased employability prospects.

One of the key indicators of the importance of secondary education in St. Vincent and the Grenadines is the level of investment made by the government. The second-largest allocation of the national budget goes to secondary education, which highlights the government's commitment to providing quality education for all citizens. The investment in secondary education has led to improved facilities, infrastructure, and teaching quality, which in turn has created a conducive environment for learning.

Additionally, secondary education is essential for social and personal development. It provides students with the necessary skills to navigate through the complexities of life, make informed decisions, and contribute meaningfully to society. By providing a platform for socialization, secondary education promotes diversity, inclusivity, and tolerance, which are vital elements for building a strong and harmonious society as expounded in the Ministry of Education and National Reconciliation's mission statement.

St. Vincent and the Grenadines has twenty-nine (29) secondary education institutions, with twentyone (21) being public and eight (8) being church-owned with government assistance. In 2021-2022, there were nine-thousand five hundred and sixty-six (9,566) secondary students enrolled with a majority attending public schools. The number of teachers increased from seven hundred and ninety-nine (799) in 2020-2021 to 803 in 2021-2022, with an increasing number of female teachers. Trained teacher proportions increased from 57.08% to 64.13% between 2015-2016 and 2021-2022, with 72.62% of trained teachers being female in 2021-2022. However, there are still concerns about students not meeting benchmarks or dropping out, with 91 students exiting prematurely in 2021-2022.







#### Technical and Vocational Education and Training

Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) is a crucial aspect of economic development in St. Vincent and the Grenadines. A skilled workforce is essential for economic growth, innovation, and competitiveness in the global market. With the ever-changing nature of work, it is important to provide education and training that will prepare individuals for the workforce.

TVET is vital in St. Vincent and the Grenadines as it helps to bridge the gap between education and employment. Through TVET, individuals can develop the necessary skills and competencies needed for the job market, including technical, practical, and vocational skills. With a highly skilled workforce, companies are able to produce goods and services of a higher quality more efficiently, which is essential for growth and success in today's global economy.

Moreover, TVET helps to reduce unemployment rates and poverty levels in St. Vincent and the Grenadines. By providing individuals with the skills and knowledge needed for employment, they are more likely to secure a job and earn a decent living. This not only benefits the individual but also contributes to the economic growth of the country. With a lower unemployment rate, there is less strain on government resources, and more revenue is generated through taxes.

In addition, TVET provides opportunities for lifelong learning and career advancement. With the rapid changes in technology and the workforce, individuals must continue to develop their skills and knowledge to remain relevant in their chosen field. Through TVET, individuals can access training and education programs that will help them to keep up with the latest developments in their field and enhance their career prospects.

St. Vincent and the Grenadines provides Technical Vocational Education and Training (TVET) at secondary level mainly through four Technical Institutes, while the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Community College offers TVET programs at the post-secondary level. In the 2021-2022 academic year, 222 students (83 males and 139 females) were enrolled in TVET programs at the Technical Institutes, with the highest enrollment at the Campden Park Technical Institute and the lowest at the Kingstown Technical Institute.

St. Vincent and the Grenadines has established a TVET Certification Framework, enabling the issuance of National Vocational Qualifications (NVQs) and Caribbean Vocational Qualifications (CVQs). The Sector Skills Development Agency (SSDA) and its secretariat, the National Qualifications Department (NQD), are responsible for developing TVET programs and certification.

To enhance the TVET system's capacity, the government has invested in the TVET Development Project, financed by the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB). The project aims to address the capacity-building needs for expanding access to TVET programs and improving the learning environment. Additionally, the CDB project includes the construction of smart classrooms at the four Technical Institutes.

#### **Tertiary Education**

In July of 2022, an Education (Miscellaneous Amendment) Act was passed in the House of Assembly. This act amended the following education related legislations:

*i.* Caribbean Examination Council Act Chapter 200;

- *ii.* Education Act Chapter 202;
- *iii.* Further and Higher Education (Accreditation) Act Chapter 203;
- iv. Saint Vincent and the Grenadines Community College Act 204; and the

v. Sector Skills Development Agency Act Chapter 218A

The passage of the Education (Miscellaneous Amendment) Act 2022 provided the legislative framework for the responsibility of Post-Secondary Education and Higher Education to be removed from under the Minister of Education and placed under that of the Prime Minister. The Prime Minister is now the Minister with responsibilities for Post-Secondary Education, including the SVG Community College (Four Divisions), Tertiary Education and Accreditation.

In the Estimates of Revenue and Expenditures for the fiscal year 2023 a new Department of Post-Secondary and Higher Education was established with an allocation of \$501,550 for recurrent expenditure. The St. Vincent and the Grenadines Community College (SVGCC) our premier national institution's subvention has increased from EC14,100,000 in 2022 to \$15,500,000 in 2023. Currently, the Community College has four divisions that include: The Division of Arts, Science and General Studies, Division of Technical and Vocational Education, Division of Nursing Education and Division of Teacher Education. The present enrolment is 2157. Of this number 1251 are females.

Higher Education training remains a top priority of the government's educational thrust. The aim is to have at least one university graduate per household by the year 2030. Many Vincentians continue to access university level training locally, regionally and internationally. The government provides a number of scholarships, bursaries and other financial support to persons enrolled in tertiary level training. Close to 1000 students recently received tuition scholarships to pursue their university training, with the majority offered to persons registered in programmes at the University of the West Indies, Open Campus which is a regional university campus that offers several online degree programmes.

There are also a number of foreign medical colleges with campuses on the island. They include Trinity Medical Sciences University, St. James School of Medicine, American University of St. Vincent and Richmond Gabriel University (formerly All Saints University). These medical colleges cater primarily for foreign students however, there are a few Vincentian students enrolled at some of these campuses.



### Library Services

Library services in St. Vincent and the Grenadines started in 1893. The National Public Library, Archives and Documentation Services network consists of twenty-three (22) libraries, a National Archives and a Documentation Centre. The National Public Library, located in Kingstown, the capital of St. Vincent and the Grenadines, is the main library while there are twenty-one (21) branch libraries situated throughout the rest of the country.

The Documentation Centre was established in 1982, and its role has been to provide social and economic information emanating from government documents, policy makers, the public, the private sector, and researchers. The National Archives was established in 1990. The National Archives collects, organizes, preserves and stores records and documents related to the history of St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

#### Programmes and Services

Programmes and services offered in the libraries are aimed at providing information for academic, recreation and research purposes as well as to provide access to information in a variety of formats. Programmes and services currently being offered are:

- Audio book service for the print disabled
- Access to a number of EBSCOhost databases
- Online Storytime
- After School Programme
  - Remedial Reading
  - Math
  - Language Arts
- Access to eBooks
- Library Caravan (outreach service)
- Book Club
- Story telling for pre-schoolers
- Literacy programmes
- Home-work Club
- HYPE: Helping Young People Excel programme, held during the July August vacation, for children ages 11 15 years. This programme is only held at the National Public Library.
- CLAP for Fun Programme for children 5 12 years, also held during the July August vacation. This programme is held at the National Public Library and fifteen (15) branch libraries.

The library's collection will be enhanced by the incorporation of various media to meet the evolving informational needs of our diverse communities.

There are two computer rooms that offer internet service. Wi-Fi services are also available at the National Public Library, the National Archives and Documentation Centre and in all branch libraries.

The Department has a website, as well as a Facebook and Instagram page. These platforms are used to give inform about the department and its various services and programmes as well as to give information on upcoming activities and events.

### Library Management Software

The information management system used at the National Public Library, Calliaqua Branch Library, the Georgetown Branch Library and Rose Hall Branch Library is Alexandria. Alexandria has recently been updated to a web-based version. This update allows persons to search the library's catalogue as well as access their personal library account online.

The other branch libraries still issue books manually using the Brown System.

### The way forward

The National Public Library, Archives and Documentation Centre will continue to implement and develop programmes and services that will benefit the citizens of St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

The library's commitment to the development of services and programmes for the blind will continue through the acquisition and provision of material in accessible formats as well through the hosting of computer training sessions.

The promotion and development of a positive image of the profession and the Department will continue through training and marketing.

Library hours will be extended in order to increase accessibility to the library and to ensure that the growing information needs of the public are met.
